Summary

Lays out, fits, and welds fabricated, cast, and forged components to assemble structural forms such as machinery frames, tanks, pressure vessels, furnace shells, and building and bridge parts by performing the following duties.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

Allocates personnel and jobs on basis of work load, space, and equipment available.

Selects equipment and plans layout, assembly, and welding.

Lays out, positions, aligns, and fits components together.

Bolts, clamps, and tack-welds parts to secure in position for welding.

Sets up equipment and welds parts, using arc, gas-shielded arc, submerged arc, or gas welding equipment.

Assembles parts by bolting and riveting.

Repairs products by dismantling, straightening, reshaping, and reassembling parts.

Ensures all jobs are completed on time and to the required standard.

Oversees workers engaged in the welding fabrication department to ensure the smooth flow of all jobs through the department.

Oversees workers engaged in keeping premises of establishment clean and in good repair.

Supervisory Responsibilities

Directly supervises one employee in the Fencing.

Physical Demands

The employee must occasionally lift and /or move Up to 25 kilograms.
